Healing Touch Level 1 Class to Underserved Communities

Our goal is to increase accessibility of Healing Touch Level 1 classes to underserved communities.

Healing Touch Worldwide Foundation is accepting applications to support interested Healing Touch Instructors in teaching Healing Touch Level 1 to underserved communities in the United States who desire to learn, yet are unable to pay for the class.

This pilot program will run through **May 31th, 2018**.

- Is limited to instructors in the United States
- Funding is dependent on community need, available funds, and diversity of requests

Requirements:

- Have taught at least five Healing Touch Level 1 classes
- In good standing with Healing Touch Program
- Letter(s) of support or invitation from the community and/or organization leader
- Expected class of no less than 6 students
- Instructor to organize all aspects of securing a facility and students to attend
- Instructor will adhere to the Healing Touch Program guidelines and code of ethics for coordinating and teaching the class

Compensation:

- A stipend of \$250/day (\$500 total) to instructors
 - ~ Paid when final report & picture of the class are received
 - ~ Can be used to offset class expenses (i.e. facility, books, certificates...)
- Limited and reasonable travel/lodging
- Community in-kind support requested
- One grant per instructor per year is available

With this service pilot, Healing Touch Worldwide Foundation wishes to recognize and incentivize the service so many instructors have already given, and/or wish to provide.
