An incentivized program for U.S. Healing Touch Instructors

To teach a Healing Touch Level 1 Class to Underserved Communities

Our goal is to increase accessibility of Healing Touch Level 1 classes to underserved communities who desire to learn, yet are unable to pay for classes.

Healing Touch Worldwide Foundation is accepting applications to support interested Healing Touch Instructors through May 31, 2019:

- Is limited to instructors in the United States
- Funding is dependent on community need, available funds, and diversity of requests

Requirements:

- Have taught at least five Healing Touch Level 1 classes
- In good standing with Healing Touch Program
- Letter(s) of support or invitation from the community and/or organization leader
- Expected class of no less than 6 students
- Instructor to organize all aspects of securing a facility and students to attend
- Will adhere to the Healing Touch Program (HTP) guidelines and code of ethics for coordinating and teaching the class
 - ~ Register the class with HTP
 - ~ Follow HTP's instructor manual scholarship policy if seeking reduced student fees



Exclusions:

- HTWF does not pay the HTP student fee, certificate fee or notebook fee

Compensation:

- Limited and reasonable travel/lodging
- A stipend of \$250/day (\$500 total) to instructors
 - ~ Paid when final report & picture of the class are received
 - ~ Can be used to offset class expenses (i.e. facility, books, certificates...)
- Community in-kind support requested
- One grant per instructor per year is available
